

How to get your club membership:

You'll need proof of current registration (or VIN if you have a side x side that is more than 1000lbs)

Proof of insurance, all ATVs and Side X Side/UTVs

Membership pricing:

- Single membership, one machine with up to two members is \$40
- Family membership, spouse and children under 21, up to three machines is \$50
- **Up to two additional machines can be added to a family plan at \$10 each for a total of five machines on a family membership**
- Day pass, September only, one machine, \$20

Where to get your club membership:

- The Oswego County ATV Club Inc campground on Saturdays and Sundays. Weekdays by appointment. Located on County Rt 22 just south of State Route 13, on the west side of the highway. The Pulaski/Williamstown railroad bed trail runs right next to the campground
- Union Station gas station and convenience store. Located on State Route 13 in Altmar
- Tailwater Lodge, in Altmar
- Altmar Hotel, in Altmar
- Tug Hill Resort, in Altmar
- Bucks Family Restaurant, State Route 13 in Williamstown
- Kasoag Lake Bar and Restaurant, in Williamstown

We do not sell memberships online at this time. Memberships must be purchased in person at any of the above listed locations

Additionally and to publicly reiterate some of the clubs rules:

Helmets must be worn by all riders and passengers on ATVs as well as Side X Sides/UTVs as required by the club's insurance carrier. Please folks, without insurance we do not have a trail system, so wear those helmets.

Additionally, seat belts are required where applicable. Also a requirement of our insurance carrier.

Headlights on at all times. It can get pretty dusty at times and visibility can be poor. Adhere to posted speed limits, especially when operating on paved roads that have been opened to the club for use to connect trails.

When traveling the paved roads, keep your machine fully on the pavement at all times. Tracking off the pavement throws stones and gravel onto the paved surface creating a safety hazard for motorcyclists.

No modified/excessively loud exhaust. We have lost trails specifically due to landowner complaints about loud exhaust. Respect our landowners who graciously allow us to use their property for our enjoyment. Let's keep the volume down

It goes without saying, but please don't litter. Sometimes a water bottle or similar may accidentally fall off a machine, it happens. If you see litter on the trail, pick it up.

Stay on the marked trail. Do not bypass around mud holes or other obstacles. This has also been the cause of trail closure in the past. If you encounter a downed tree or other obstacle that is blocking a trail, report it to the club as soon as possible. It can be reported here any time, or in person at the campground mainly on weekends.
